#### Prayer Before Randleman High School Football Game

For years, popular public address announcer and Randolph County Board of Education chair Tommy McDonald has led fans in a brief prayer before football games at Randleman High School.

McDonald said his invocation in the past had always been fairly generic. Basically, he said, he asks the Lord to put his arms around the players and fans to keep them safe. He said he also asks for protection, so that everyone can make it home safely.

Someone – McDonald doesn't know who – sent him an American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) publication that defines the American judicial system's attitude toward religious observations in public settings, including prayer before school sporting events.

"This really bothers me," he said. "We've prayed before games for years and years."

As the clock ticked down to the start of the game, McDonald was still uncertain. Maybe, he speculated, he could offer the prayer and nothing would come of it.
