From Pastor Ed DO YOU KNOW WHAT I KNOW?

Just recently you received a message from your pastor which asked such a question. I think it goes without saying that this time of the year that comes with an invitation to sojourn to Bethlehem prompts such an inquiry. More than any other time in the Liturgical Calendar of the Church year, both this journey to a manger in the Holy City and the journey we walk through the season of Lent brings about the process of self-examination which, at times, can be a most painful time in our lives. When heavenly light pervades the darkness of this world which tries it's best to creep in to our lives, that which needs to be changed is made evident. Consequently, we see the connection between Christ's birth, death, and resurrection. At his birth we discover the realization of the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation for the world he created with his own hands and called good. At his death and his resurrection, we see God's mission come to pass and the Scripture John 3:16 firmly in place. grace and when we wake up in it, you and I become a contagion for others as God's Holy Spirit dwells with us.

As we sojourn to this City so Holy and as we gaze upon the face of God's love in the face of the Baby Jesus, may we see with hearts made toasty and eyes opened wide the true beauty of this season and the many opportunities God provides for us along the way to be made perfect as he is perfect. In all these things---DO YOU KNOW WHAT I KNOW?
