From Pastor Ed

By the time you read this pastor's thoughts as penned in this edition of the Bell Messenger, January will be entombed and February underway. As seen through the liturgical lens of the United Methodist Church, the month of February invites us to celebrate Black History Month, Boy Scout Sunday, Transfiguration of the Lord, and as well we mark the beginning of the Season of Lent. A Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper will take place this year at Burnetts Chapel UMC February 17th. This meal serves as a blessing in which we partake of the riches of God's Providential Care as reasoned by the food we eat and the fellowship we engage in. In short-we celebrate a season of plenty before we, as did Jesus, walk through the wilderness of our lives seeking the greater knowledge of God and His will for us. More information concerning this meal will be made available soon.

The next night, Wednesday (18th), an Ash Wednesday Service complete with the imposition of ashes will take place at Old Union UMC. This service will begin at 7:00 pm. This service marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. This is a time when we as God's children are invited to enter into the process of self-examination as we acknowledge our human nature---we are dust, and to dust we shall return. The inventory of self we experience can at times be quite painful. The inspection of self we experience brings us faceto-face with the current condition of our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. As well, this "wilderness exam" invites us to participate in the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus upon the Cross as we through these forty days give up something we normally enjoy. Additionally we can accomplish this through the practice of some sort of discipleship or servitude we normally would not engage in. I pray you will take seriously this practice and

see it as a true privilege in which we engage as you draw closer to the side of our Savior.

The secular world sees the month of February as "True Love" in motion as Cupid flies around shooting arrows at people while Valentine hearts float about here and there. "Be My Valentine" are words shared communally between people of all ages. But please consider this most important thought. Just this past Sunday I shared a message with the church that hopefully caused us to see that no matter where we've been, no matter how our past might look--how right, wrong, or indifferent, God calls us to be apostles to be sent out in the endeavor to share some really great news with a world that not only needs to hear and accept it, but more importantly put it into practice! Could it be that not only during this month but each and every month of our lives, God is saying to us through the lens of Divinity and Sovereignty--"WOULD YOU BE MINE" ? Jesus Christ loved us all the way to the Cross and then beyond. The invitation Jesus extends to us to be his---fully his---is an invitation to be radically changed through redeeming grace and "TRUE LOVE! Why not answer the call of God upon your life by saying--"Yes Lord! I will be yours! And you are mine!
